PALM SUNDAY:

Two of Jesus' disciples are sent to borrow the animals on which the savior of the world would ride into Jerusalem. Imagine being the owner of these animals. How would you respond? What would you think of the disciples' simple explanation that the Lord needs them? These are your animals, and no one asked to take them – and who is this Lord who needs them?

I wonder how we might respond today when confronted with a similar solicitation. Perhaps someone, possibly unknown to us, asks us for the loan of a resource – prayer, time, or finances – with “the Lord needs them” as the only explanation. The request might seem perplexing, as it was undoubtedly for the owner of the donkey and her colt. But those unexpected ways in which we are invited to participate in God's work are chances to glimpse the kingdom of God, in all its glory, come riding down the road.
