Easter Reflection

We might be tempted to forget
about God in good times, but
during hard times, such as illness
or family crisis, our fears and
insecurities can bring us back to
God and his unconditional love.
God gave his only Son so that we
might have eternal life. We then
can turn to God for help in our
hour of need.

Today's Gospel recalls the
appearance of Jesus to two
disciples on the road to Emmaus.
They were confused, perhaps
frightened, and Jesus showed them
the way. In breaking of the bread
he revealed himself as the risen
Christ, and the disciples' hearts
burned within. In our own life's
journey, we are able to carry our
crosses because Jesus walks with
us. He is guiding and protecting –
we need to learn to look with our
hearts and eyes to recognize His
presence.
