SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT...

Love is a verb, not a noun!

REFLECTION

As humans, our gaze only extends as far as the material world around us. Our sense can only inform us about the immediate and sensory surroundings. As a result, we formulate certain conclusions about the nature of existence.

In today's gospel, Jesus reminds his listeners that the perspective of God is immensely greater than what the human senses can take in. God sees into the deep crevices of space and through the eons of time. God's comprehension is infinitely unfathomable for the human minds.

It can be easy to feel like our immediate concerns are of the utmost importance, but Christ redirects our attention to concerns that – while beyond our current gaze – are of even greater significance: the moral jeopardy our souls are in.

When Christ states “fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell,” he does so because the peril of this danger is not evident to us yet, but we need to heed it.

Yet Jesus' message has a positive side to it. While there is evil lurking that can ravage our souls, there is also a kingdom that awaits us in God's reality. Those who call on the name of Jesus Christ in this life will be acknowledged by Jesus in the reality to come, a reality far greater and more permanent than this fleeting plane of existence.
