SUNDAY REFLECTION

John 20:16. Jesus said to her, “Mary!” She  
turned and said to him in Hebrew,  
“Rabbouni!” (which means Teacher)

The gardener – Jesus – calls Mary by  
name, and she recognizes him.  
Knowing a person’s name establishes a  
level of rapport that a mere greeting  
cannot accomplish. When Jesus is  
raised, he addresses several people by  
name. Even after his crucifixion and  
death, Jesus returns to do the work he  
has always intended to do, but now  
things are far different. He is  
everywhere and is available to greet us  
by name in the same way we greet him  
in prayer.

Christ’s resurrection invites us to  
remember the moments we have  
encountered blessings, intentionally  
personal blessings. It is almost as if  
Christ called us directly by name to bless  
us. We recall these blessings and reflect  
on how they give us life with the same  
grace and love that Jesus calls Mary by  
name today. The life we are given by  
God gets even better today. The new  
window of eternity is open, and  
absolutely everyone’s included. We  
begin, though, by hearing Christ call us  
by name.
