SUNDAY REFLECTION

John 20:25b. But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the marks of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

As the Easter service unfolds every year with its triumphant celebration of Jesus' resurrection, I have mixed thoughts about the story. I have questions about exactly what happened and why, doubts the empty tomb and Jesus rising from the dead. I have questions about the afterlife and what that means for me and those I love. So, it's something of a relief on the second Sunday of Easter to hear the same gospel every year. In comes Thomas with his doubts and nagging questions. He even questions the metaphysics of the whole deal. But Thomas shows us that we can have doubt and belief and that doubt can strengthen our faith. Thomas helps us to know that every Sunday is Easter. He encourages us to come together with other believers and doubters, to worship in community as we are fed through Jesus' presence in the Eucharist, giving thanks for God's abundant grace.
