SUNDAY REFLECTION

Just about everyone has experienced a
power outage at some time. With our
modern dependence on electricity,
when it fails we can find ourselves at a
loss, uncertain how to accomplish even
the most ordinary tasks. We resort to
substitutes, such as batteries,
generators, candles. Depending on how
long the outage lasts, we begin to alter
our patterns. Life just isn't the same
when we lose connection to the power
supply.

And so it is with the spiritual life. If we
lose our connection to Christ, the
source of all spiritual life, we become
spiritually disoriented. In those
moments we can find ourselves
searching for substitutes that will give
us at least a temporary security but that
ultimately will fail us and increase our
loneliness. The difference is that the
power of Christ's love is never turned
off. Rather, we sometimes unplug
ourselves.

If we are not tapped into the source of
spiritual life – into Christ, the true vine
– if we are not fed by the sap of Christ's
love, our spirit withers and dies, just as
our bodies wither and die if we do not
receive sufficient nourishment to
sustain them.

As we pray this week, let us ask for the
grace to remain connected to our God,
because apart from him, we are
