REFLECTION

Psalm 29:2 Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his Name, worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.

The scripture readings for today’s celebration of the Trinity focus on the holiness of God. If you attend a church service with music, you will likely sing many hymns that cry out “Holy, Holy, Holy!” In one church, I sat near a stained-glass window with this verse from Psalm 29 etched on it, and I meditated on it when my attention drifted during parts of the liturgy. The relationship between beauty and holiness intrigued me. It is not hard for me to feel worshipful in a soaring cathedral, surrounded by beautiful stained-glass windows and expert organ-playing. But God’s holiness is not dependent on our aesthetic preferences.

The beauty of holiness is the divinity that is the Holy Trinity, Three-in-One. It is a mystery so beyond our human comprehension or explanation that all we can do is fall down in worship, in awe at the beauty and holiness that is our God.
