Week 6: Colours

You may have noticed the colour of the vestments, the altar cloth and decorations change at different times of the year. The change of colour helps us enter in the seasons of the church, the special times. Lent and advent are times of meditation, prayer and penitence and are marked by the colour purple. Christmas and Easter are times of celebration and are marked by white. In ordinary times, green invites us to reflection and meditation. As you see, at Mass all colours have a purpose and we have been working at it for over two thousand years.
