LITURGY 101

Welcome to Liturgy 101-back to basics!
Week 18: Celebration of the Word
When there is no priest to celebrate the Mass, it is important for the community to come together to proclaim and meditate on the Word of the Lord, to pray as a community, to say the Our Father and receive the Body of Christ from previously consecrated hosts. A deacon, a pastoral agent or a lay person is called to lead the assembly in prayer. This does not replace the mass but helps the community until, by our prayers, the Lord answers the call of vocation. It is also recommended to take communion to members of the community who cannot attend. When we bring holy communion to a sick person it is always important to read the Gospel of the day, to pray, and to say the Our Father before giving communion. It must always become an encounter, a celebration of Jesus’ presence and love and not a ‘quick-fix’. – Fr. Pierre
