REFLECTION

*1 Corinthians 3:9a. For we are God's servants,
working together.*

Truth be told, I often like working
alone. I can set my own schedule,

Yet aloneness is not what we are
created for. Remember, in the very
beginning, God says that it is not
good for anyone to be alone. We are
created to be together in work and

Further on in his letter to the
Corinthians, Saint Paul articulates

that enhances the entire body,
enabling it to do more than any one
